## **CALL FOR PAPERS**

**Closing date: 31 August 1995**

The conference theme is **Crime, Criminology and Change**. We wish to pursue this idea of change not only in terms of the content of papers but in the manner of presentation of papers. We welcome therefore innovative proposals for this.

We encourage proposals for papers and workshops which generally reflect the extent to which crime, criminology and penal policy have changed over recent years and the implications of these changes. We are in particular interested in papers which address the study of crime, policing and punishment in the context of changing political rationalities and their likely impact on both the development of criminology as an academic discipline and the criminal justice arena as a whole.

It is expected that prominent themes will include (but are not limited to):

- public/private dimensions of criminal justice provision.
- indigenous justice issues.
- initiatives in criminal justice.
- technological developments in criminal justice.
- the future of policing, punishment and the prevention of crime.
- the political economy of crime and changing conceptions of crime.
- innovations in teaching criminology.
- theoretical and historical research which explain various aspects of 'the present'.
- new theoretical initiatives.
- transforming and transgressing criminological boundaries
- deconstructing crime and gender.

We hope that the Conference papers will both stimulate debate about the present and provide a vision for the future.

## MINUTES

### **Previous Minutes**

There were no previous minutes.

### **Business arising**

### **General Business**

#### 1. President's Report

Tabled and accepted

#### 2. Treasurer's Report

The new Treasurer had only just accepted office and, consequently, gave no report. The outgoing Treasurer did not provide a report.

#### 3. Secretary's Report

The new Secretary had only just accepted office and, consequently, gave no report. The outgoing Secretary did not provide a report.

#### 4. Fees

Notice was given to the meeting that our publishers, Butterworths had recently increased the cost of publishing the Journal from \$70.00 to \$85.00 per member. Discussion centred around the appropriateness of a fee increase at this time, and the issue of whether or not the society could continue to subsidise student memberships at a reduced fee. It was decided to increase the membership fees to \$95.00 and to cease offering reduced fee student memberships.

5. Teleconferences

The issue of communication between committee members was canvassed. The Secretary undertook to organise and conduct three teleconferences per year in an attempt to keep the committee informed of the society's business.

6. Publisher

Dissatisfaction with the publisher, Butterworths, was voiced by several committee members. In particular, the Editor of the journal expressed a range of dissatisfactions with the poor organisation at Butterworths, their apparent inability to keep membership lists up-to-date and their rising costs. It was resolved that the Secretary would enquire with other publishers regarding the service that they could offer. The intention of the meeting was that we should seriously consider changing publishers as soon as a new publisher who could meet our needs at a reasonable cost could be found.

7. Membership

Two issues were raised. First, the apparently poor state of the society's membership list. It was resolved that the Secretary would renew efforts to bring this up to date. Second, that there appears to be a number of unfinancial members who still receive the journal. The Secretary undertook to pursue these outstanding fees and to ensure that in future, the membership list is kept current.

The next AGM will be held in Brisbane, July 1997 during the ANZSOC Conference to be hosted by Griffith University.
